Camillian Chaplaincy House in Bataan Inaugurated

Just as Archangel Gabriel announced the good news to Mary that she would bear in her womb the Son of God on the Feast of Annunciation, the Camillians in the Philippines received good tidings as well on March 25, 2023. It was on this day that the Very Honorable Ruperto C. Santos, Bishop of Balanga, blessed and inaugurated the new Camillian Chaplaincy House in Bataan.

A Holy Mass was celebrated in the small chapel of the chaplaincy house led by Bishop Santos. Those who were present in the joyful occasion were Fr. Dan Cancino, MI, the vicar provincial together with Camillian priests and brothers, Fr. Ernesto de Leon, rector and parish priest of St. Joseph Cathedral-Shrine Parish and with Bataan priests, doctors and patrons of the Camillians.

Located in Tuyo, Balanga City, Bataan, the first barangay in Balanga and known for its *tinapang*

tuyo, the Camillian Chaplaincy House was realized through the kindness and generosity of the Abello siblings, namely, Victor Abello+, Engracia Consunji, Teresita Ortiguerra, Amelia Anastacio and Fortunato Abello, in loving memory of their parents—Dr. Tomas Abello and Concepcion Banzon.

The Camillian priests started serving as chaplains in Balanga, Bataan since July 2019 and have been residing in a rented house.

At present Fr. Bon Arimbuyutan, MI and Fr. Jayson Labrador, MI are serving three hospitals in Balanga: Bataan Doctors Hospital and Medical Center (BDHMC), Bataan St. Joseph Hospital and Medical Center (BSJHMC) and Centro Medico de Santisimo Rosario.

Their primary ministry is to guide the spiritual needs of the sick, caregivers, doctors, nurses and hospital servers.

The message of the Holy Father on the 31st World Day of the Sick reminds us of the existential challenge of being human and vulnerable. Tragedy leaves us stunned and sometimes abandoned, and loneliness sets in, making us question our relationship with God and others.

One big challenge in addressing this is to make the Church an embodiment of the Good Samaritan, offering compassionate care in times when understanding and empathy are badly needed. I wish to reiterate our Holy Father's message, urging us to remember our shared humanity and lift each other, cutting through indifference and embracing our interconnectedness.

We share the news about our continuing witness of God's Mercy towards the sick. Our presence and activities in the Diocese of Balanga and the continuing services of our chaplaincies and institutions are encouraging signs of embracing our interconnectedness. Furthermore, we continue to thank the Lord for the gift of vocation in religious life as it flourishes in our Province and, in particular, in the Delegation of Indonesia.

Our continuing evangelization in our respective communities in the field of healthcare is a clear response to the invitation of Pope Francis to dispel isolation and abandonment in healthcare service—that is devoid of respect and compassion. Here, in this issue, we see some faces of our aspiration to care.

Fr. Ivo Anselmi Installed as Parish Priest

On March 12, 2023, Fr. Ivo Anselmi, MI was installed as the 8th Parish Priest of Our Lady of La Paz Parish during the celebration of the Holy Mass presided by Fr. Roderick Castro, Rector of the National Shrine of the Sacred Heart and Vicar Forane of the Vicariate of Sts. Peter and Paul.

As representative of Cardinal Advincula, Fr. Eric Castro in his message, reminded the importance of a strong connection between the parish priest and the people and a parish priest being a shepherd to his flock, the community.

This is the second time Fr. Ivo was installed as such because he became the 3rd parish priest of the La Paz Parish from 1995 to 2001, after Frs. Alberto Roman, MI and Mario Didone, MI.

Fr. Ivo, who celebrated his 48th sacerdotal ordination anniversary last March 2 this year, was the Provincial Superior for nine years from 2000 to 2010. His last assignment was as Superior/Novice Master of the Novitiate Community in Baguio City.

Now that he is back to his old home, this saying may hold true: "Love is lovelier the second time around."

Camillians in Indonesia on the XXXI World Day of the Sick

The XXXI World Day of the Sick, celebrated by the Catholic Church last February 11, 2023, was also a precious opportunity to bring together the Camillians of Indonesia with their 70 seminarians in the St. Camillus Chapel of the civil hospital of Maumere, island of Flores.

The ceremony, which was celebrated here in Maumere on Sunday, February 12, with a solemn Eucharist concelebration, was particularly attended by several patients, doctors, nurses, friends and relatives of the sick.

After the concelebration other meaningful events took place, like the visit to the sick made by a group of doctors and nurses, as well as by several Camillian seminarians to accompany the priests in the administration of the sacrament of Anointing. Another touching moment was the offering to each patient of a small rose, a symbol of good luck, as well as some small gifts which brought smiles of joy and words of gratitude to many suffering faces.

On the same day, a group of seminarians also visited dozens of sick and elderly people in the villages of the neighboring parish bringing Holy Communion and simple gifts. The day was really a precious occasion during which the Camillians and seminarians felt like a big family and, once again, became the "living continuators" of the charism of the Founder St. Camillus, who saw in the sick the very face of Jesus.

Camillians Growing in Indonesia

Two new Camillian priests [Frs. Silvester Naikofi, MI and Arnoldus Silvanus, MI] and three new deacons [Brs. Dionisius Juang, MI, Bonifonsius Lolan, MI and Andreas Yobe, MI] were ordained on Sunday, January 29, 2023 in the chapel of the Camillian Seminary in Nita, Maumere, island of Flores. It was a 3 1/2-hour ceremony that was experienced with great emotion, especially by the two new priests and their parents and relatives.

[The occasion was graced by the presence of Camillian confreres from the Province and its delegations: Fr.

Evan Paul Villanueva, Provincial Superior; Fr. Placido de Jose, Provincial Secretary; Fr. Angel Crisostomo, Provincial Councilor; Fr. Jacob Wong, Delegate Superior of Taiwan; Fr. Marcelo Pamintuan, Jr., Delegate Superior of Australia; and Fr. Alfons Oles, Delegate Superior of Indonesia. Also present were Camillian Indonesian, Italian and Pakistani priests and other invited Indonesian priests and religious.]

The Camillians, after about 13 years of presence in Indonesia, now count 8 local priests, 4 deacons, 24 professed, 4 novices and 54 seminarians studying Philosophy, including 4 Pakistanis and 1 from East Timor.

In addition to the formation of seminarians, the Camillians also devote themselves to social and charitable activities for children from poor families and dozens of mentally ill people for whom there is no medical care on the island. They are also committed in the pastoral service in some hospitals and the weekly visits to the sick in the parishes.

Lastly, a positive news is that, now, the Camillians of Indonesia are ready to proclaim the Gospel in other countries. In fact, two priests will be sent soon as mission chaplains to Australia and the Philippines, respectively.

but one's self, and b) when there is conversion, which means a re-directioning, a greater resolve and closer relationship with the Lord.

3. A quote from St. Anselm for further reflection: "Teach me to seek you, and when I seek you show yourself to me, for I cannot seek you unless you teach me, nor can I find you unless you show yourself to me. Let me seek you in desiring you and desire you in seeking you, find you in loving you and love you in finding you."

After being away from home for quite sometime, the seminarians had a well-spent time with their parents and family on Family Day on February 24-26, 2023. This event truly highlighted that the family is the fount of love, thus this year's theme, *Pamilya: Hwaran ng Paglilingkod at Bukal ng Pagibig* (Family: Example of Service and Fount of Love).

The parents and other relatives of the seminarians got the chance to experience the daily prayers (lauds and vespers) that the seminarians usually do, aside from Eucharistic celebrations. Prayer is an integral part of the formation of the seminarians, especially in the spiritual dimension of formation. It is always regarded as the source of strength, making them stronger to answer the daily call to serve.

Fr. Froilan Emer Ma. Gale De Atras, Jr., MMHC, facilitated the session on the family. The session opened the seminarians and parents to face topics not often discussed within the family. It became an avenue to know and understand more the sentiments of seminarians as



well as their parents'. It was a time of healing and blossoming.

To underline their unfeigned love for their families, the seminarians paid tribute to them with roses, hugs, and kisses and program showcasing their hidden talents.

The seminarians express their gratitude to all who gave their love and support for this event and for making this memorable moments possible.

Sch. Andrew Talks on Vow of Chastity



In continuation of the guidance and counseling program of the seminarians, Sch. Andrew Kang, MI, talked about the vow of chastity on March 9, 2023.

In this session, Sch. Andrew highlighted that the primary reason why priests have this vow is that Jesus taught perfect chastity through the witnessing of life rather than words to give himself totally and freely.

Chastity is defined as refraining from immoral sexual relations outside marriage. It is then a virtue whereby adults refrain from all unlawful sexual activity and intercourse. With that, Sch. Andrew pointed out that the call to chastity is not only for priests or religious but even for married couples or other people desiring to be chaste.

It is not new to hear priests or religious violating or struggling on this vow. That is why Sch. Andrew said that "when at times there are some misgivings, failures, or

temptations regarding chastity, it could be a sign that our love for God has weakened and that his presence in our heart is neglected or become sterile." He suggested that one can solve this by turning to God and by having an active and meaningful prayer life.

It is stated in Lumen Gentium 42, chastity is a precious gift of divine grace given by the Father to certain souls. Also in Perfectae Caritatis 12, it is said that chastity is an outstanding gift of grace.

Indeed, adhering and being true to the vow of chastity is difficult, but not impossible. Sch. Andrew ended the session leaving the seminarians with the statement "Don't play with fire for too long and too often."

Recollection from Laity

To prepare the seminarians for the Holy Week apostolate, they had their recollection with Ms. Jo Ann Judimo, MA.

In this activity, Ms. Jo Ann reminded the seminarians to steer clear of tendencies such as the manifestation of self-righteousness, know-it-all mentality, Messianic Syndrome, and the like. She also highlighted that one expression of love is the presence in the community. Knowing and relating with them can inspire genuine and meaningful dialogue.

The session was an eye-opener to the seminarians of the realities in the apostolate areas. It was also a pleasure for them to see a new perspective from a layperson's point of view. Ms. Jo Ann ended the recollection by encouraging the seminarians to be faithful to the service entrusted to them.
