### Years 1975-2025

Neatly framing the 50 years of service, these dates construct a clear historical timeline, emphasizing the enduring presence and steadfast commitment of the Camillians in the Philippines.

### Number 50 in Bold and Gold

The milestone year '50' is prominently displayed in bold, gold (or yellow) font, symbolizing not just the golden anniversary but also the courage, resilience, and luminous spirit with which the Camillians have served the sick, embodying the light of Christ in their ministry. The Sacred Host, depicted as broken in the logo, represents the Mystical Body of the Suffering Christ, who identifies Himself with the sick, the poor, and the needy. This imagery serves as a profound reminder of the Camillian commitment to serving Christ by ministering to those poor sick in need of compassion and care.

### Theme 'Puso sa Misyon'

Translated as 'Heart in the Mission,' this Filipino phrase, presented in a dynamic font, beautifully encapsulates the core of the Camillian mission. It declares that each Camillian heart is wholeheartedly dedicated to the mission of compassion and care.

### Colors of the Philippine Flag

The incorporation of blue, yellow, and red mirrors the hues of the Philippine flag, firmly grounding the logo in the nation's identity, a respectful nod to the home that has embraced the Camillian mission for half a century.

Collectively, these elements not only commemorate the past five decades of the Camillian mission in the Philippines but also kindle a flame of inspiration for continued dedication and service in the years ahead. The logo stands as a visual testament to the enduring spirit, unyielding commitment, and compassionate heart that define the Camillian Philippine Province.

## THE ARRIVAL OF THE CAMILLIANS IN THE PHILIPPINES

In the 1960s, Fr. Hernando Maceda, SJ, returned to the Philippines with a relic of St. Camillus' heart. This relic was a farewell gift from his friend, Fr. Mario Vanti, MI, accompanied by a request: "Pray that one day the Order of St. Camillus will be established in your country." This vision took root in the 1970s through the efforts of Fr. Antonio Crotti, MI, Superior of the Taiwan Vice-Province, who envisioned creating a nucleus of local vocations among Catholic men in the Philippines to carry out the Camillian charism in service to the Church and the sick.

1974

Ivo Anselmi and Pietro Ferri, arrived in Manila to complete their theological studies at the Loyola School of Theology in Quezon City. Fr. Hernando Maceda, SJ, gave them the relic of St. Camillus, marking the beginning of a Camillian Foundation in the Philippines.

1975

In March 8, the first Camillian Community in the Philippines was established in Quezon City under the Lombardo-Venetian Province. The community included Fr. Ernesto Nidini as the first Superior, Fr. Alberto Roman, and newly ordained priests Fr. Ivo Anselmi, Fr. Pietro Ferri, and Fr. Anselmo Zambotti.

1976

March 25, the community became part of the Vice-Province of Taiwan.

1977

More religious members arrived, including Fr. Luigi Galvani, Fr. Mario Didone, and Bro. Angelino Aldegheri.

1979

The second Camillian community in Makati was established on March 3, 1979, with Fr. Luigi as Superior.

1981

A new parish church was built and dedicated to Our Lady of La Paz on December 12, 1981.

## FORMATION HOUSES

In response to the growing number of candidates for religious life, the St. Camillus Novitiate was established in Baguio City in the early 1980s, made possible through the generosity of Fr. Heinrich Dammig, who facilitated the acquisition of the property. By the mid-1980s, as the need for a dedicated formation house for college seminarians became evident, the St. Camillus College Seminary was founded in Marikina Heights.

The Camillians established their third community in Baguio City on May 9, with Fr. Giulio Ghezzi serving as both Novice Master and Superior.

**1984**

St. Camillus College Seminary was officially recognized on September 24.

The fourth Camillian community was established on May and the college seminarians moved to the new Marikina location in June.

**1986**

On May 5, seven (7) young Indonesian aspirants arrived for Camillian formation, marking the start of the St. Camillus Asian Seminary. Other nationalities from Pakistan, Taiwan, Vietnam, China and South Korea followed in the succeeding months and years.

**2000**

The pioneer Indonesian religious returned to Indonesia with Fr. Luigi Galvani to start a new foundation and formation house in Maumere, NTT, Flores, Indonesia.

**2009**

**1985**

On December 8, 1984, the ordination of the first two Filipino Camillian priests, Fr. Rolando Fernandez and Fr. Romeo de los Santos, marked a historic milestone for the Camillian mission in the Philippines.

**1999**

The construction began on the new Provinciate in Quezon City, alongside renovations of the Theologate and the Pastoral Center. That year, two Vietnamese and one Malaysian brother started their Camillian formation.

**2002**

The St. Camillus Adult Formation Center in Antipolo City was established to cater to young professionals and candidates pursuing a second vocation. The inaugural group included Filipino candidates alongside aspirants from Pakistan and South Korea.

## THE CAMILLIAN PARISHES

During the first General Assembly of the Federation of the Asian Bishops' Conference in Taipei, the late Manila Archbishop Jaime Cardinal Sin invited the Camillians to his diocese. Consequently, Fr. Alberto Roman was installed as the first pastor of the newly established Parish of Our Lady of La Paz in Makati. The community then divided into two teams: Fr. Alberto and Fr. Anselmo handled pastoral work in La Paz Parish. At the same time, Fr. Ivo and Fr. Pietro launched a vocation promotion program from Quezon City.

**1974** The first General Assembly of the Federation of the Asian Bishops' Conference in Taipei in April, the late Manila Archbishop Jaime Cardinal Sin invited the Camillians to his diocese.

**1976** March 14, Fr. Alberto Roman was installed as the first pastor of the newly established Parish of Our Lady of La Paz in Makati

**1986** At the request of Bishop Protacio Gungon, DD, the Camillians began celebrating Sunday Mass in Boso-Boso, Antipolo, initially led by Fr. Raul Uson, MI. A few months later, Fr. Rolly Fernandez, MI, expanded the presence of the Camillians by establishing an apostolate and mission in the area with the scholastics. In addition to their pastoral work, they actively contributed to the restoration of the ruins of the historic Bosoboso Church, undertaking the project with the support and dedication of the local faithful.

**2004** Following the restoration, Fr. Domingo Barawid, MI, was appointed as the first parish priest of Nuestra Señora de la Anunciata Parish. During his tenure, he established various mini pastoral councils in the mountain communities to strengthen the parish's outreach and pastoral care. Over the years, several Camillian priests have served as parish priests, including Fr. Charlie Ricafort, MI, Fr. Rene Sales, MI, Fr. Wilson Peñaranda, MI, and Fr. John Jay Magpusao, MI, among others.

**2021** Nuestra Señora de la Anunciata Parish was designated a Jubilee Church during the celebration of the 500th Anniversary of Christianity in the Philippines.

**2024** On May 25, the Rite of Dedication of the Church and its Altar was solemnly celebrated. Later, on December 18, 2024, the church was officially declared the twin church of the Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth, Israel under the pastoral leadership of Fr. John Jay Magpusao, MI. In the latter part of the year, the church received another significant recognition, being designated as one of the 14 Jubilee Churches in the Diocese of Antipolo for the Great Jubilee of 2025.

## THE CAMILLIAN CHAPLAINCY IN THE PHILIPPINES

The Camillians began their hospital chaplaincy in the Philippines, serving both government and private hospitals. Their first assignment was at the Philippine Heart Center, led by Fr. Giulio Ghezzi, MI. After completing his parish term, Fr. Alberto Roman, MI became chaplain at the National Orthopedic Hospital, while Fr. Pietro Ferri, MI served at East Avenue Medical Center.



**1982**

February 22, the start of hospital chaplaincy ministry in the Philippine Heart Center (PHC).

In December, Fr. Alberto Roman, MI, became the chaplain at the National Orthopedic Hospital.



**1984**

February 1, Fr. Pietro Ferri, MI, became the chaplain at East Avenue Medical Center.



**1991**

The Camillians had extended their chaplaincy to the National Kidney Transplant Institute, the Lung Center of the Philippines, and East Avenue Medical Center.



**1993**

Established a community of chaplains on Mabuhay Street, Diliman, Quezon City, on April 9, forming the sixth Camillian community in the Philippines.



**2002**

The Camillians acquired a property in Davao City for a chaplaincy community.



**2019**

In July, the Camillians expanded their chaplaincy to the Diocese of Balanga at the request of Bishop Ruperto Santos.



**2022**

In May, Archbishop Jose Cabantan invited the Camillians to serve at Maria Reyna Xavier University Hospital in Cagayan de Oro, where two Camillians are currently assigned.

## ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PHILIPPINE PROVINCE

In May, Fr. Luigi Galvani, MI, was appointed Vice-Provincial Superior of the Far East Vice-Province.

Fr. Anselmo Zambotti, MI, was elected General Consultor and relocated to Rome to serve as Secretary General and Secretary for the Missions.

On January 1, the Far East Vice-Province was elevated to the Far East Province, with Fr. Luigi Galvani, MI, as its first Provincial Superior.

Filipino Camillians assumed leadership of all seven communities in the Philippines.

Following a canonical visit by Superior General Fr. Frank Monks, MI, and Vicar Fr. Renato Salvatore, MI, the Philippine Province was formally established on July 14, 2003, with Taiwan as a Delegation.

Fr. Ivo Anselmi, MI, was appointed as the first Provincial Superior of the newly established Philippine Province.

Fr. Rolly Fernandez, MI was elected and appointed as the FIRST FILIPINO Camillian Provincial of the Philippine Province

Fr. Aris Miranda, MI, was elected as the first Filipino General Consultor and the third religious from the Philippine Province to serve in a higher office within the Order. He was assigned as Consultor for the Secretariat on Ministry.

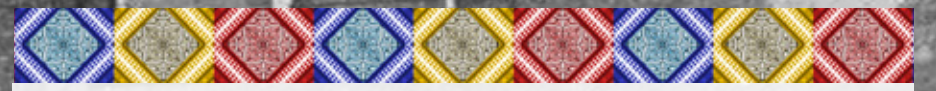

# THE CAMILLIAN INSTITUTIONS



**St. Camillus Polyclinic**  
MAKATI CITY

Fr. Luigi Galvani, MI, founded the St. Camillus Polyclinic to serve the La Paz Parish and its surrounding community. On April 30, 1980, Cardinal Jaime Sin presided over its blessing and inauguration, joined by Italian Ambassador Giuliano Bertuccioli.



**St. Camillus Medical Center**  
PASIG CITY

On February 2, 1984, Fr. Giuseppe Bressanin, Jr., MI, led the cornerstone-laying of St. Camillus Polyclinic in Pasig City. Cardinal Jaime Sin blessed and inaugurated the facility on July 19, 1986, and it later became the base of the fifth Camillian community in the Philippines on September 6, 1989.



**St. Camillus Polyclinic**  
ANTIPOLO CITY

The third St. Camillus Polyclinic was established in Brgy. Inarawan, Antipolo, and was inaugurated on January 4, 1992.



**St. Camillus Hospital**  
CALBAYOG CITY, SAMAR

The first St. Camillus Hospital in the Philippines, located in Calbayog City, Samar, was blessed and inaugurated on September 7, 1996. Two years later, it became the base of the seventh Camillian community. Among its pioneers was Fr. Amelio Troietto, MI, a Camillian priest and surgeon who had served in Italy, Taiwan, and Brazil.



**St. Camillus Hospital of Mati**  
DAVAO ORIENTAL

In January 1996, the Camillians acquired land in Mati, Davao Oriental, where Bro. Peter Schiffer, MI, from Germany, supervised the construction of a hospital, funded by the Camillian German Province. It was officially inaugurated on April 5, 1997, by Bishop Alo, DD, with Fr. Alois Kreienbaum, MI (German Provincial), Fr. Dietmar Weber, MI, Fr. Luigi Galvani, MI, and other Camillian priests in attendance.



**Nursing Homes for the Elderly and Disabled**

The St. Camillus Home of Charity in Marikina, now Camillus Medhaven Nursing Home, opened on April 6, 1992, also serving as a formation and training center for Camillian seminarians. In May 2020, the St. Camillus College building was repurposed as the Camillus Medhaven Nursing Home Annex. In June 2021, the St. Camillus Polyclinic in Inarawan, Antipolo, was converted into Camillus Medhaven.

## THE CAMILLIAN ADVOCACIES

The Camillians addressed poverty in the Philippines through outreach programs that provided essential support to the poor, particularly children. They organized free medical clinics in underserved areas, established feeding centers to combat malnutrition, and set up daycare centers to keep children off the streets. Additionally, they introduced distance adoption and scholarship programs to support education.

### DAYCARE CENTERS

In Antipolo, a daycare center was established within the St. Camillus Polyclinic, funded by the family and friends of the late Vittorino Carra. Initially, it was managed by the Daughters of St. Mary of Leuca.

In Calbayog, Samar, the Camillians set up a daycare center alongside a retreat and seminar house, providing both early childhood education and a space for spiritual formation.

### COMMUNITY HEALTH CARE

The Camillians have played a vital role in community health care, led by Fr. Tom Welu, MI, a Doctor in Public Health, who pioneered the initiative in 1987 in Balugo, Sibulan, Negros Oriental. In the 1990s, they expanded their healthcare programs to Boso-Boso, Antipolo, and nearby communities, working closely with local volunteers to provide medical and health services.

### ST. CAMILLUS PASTORAL CENTER

In 1999, the Camillians established the St. Camillus Pastoral Center, offering courses and programs focused on healthcare and pastoral care for the sick. The center also serves as a venue for retreats, conferences, and seminars. On April 9, 2021, the St. Camillus Center for Humanization in Health in the Philippines was officially launched in a virtual event.

### OTHER MINISTRIES

The Camillians actively engage in diverse ministries, including:

- HIV/AIDS Ministry
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Management
- Community-Based Healthcare Programs
- Drug Rehabilitation
- COVID-19 Pandemic Response

They also collaborate with the Episcopal Commission on Healthcare and the Diocesan Commission on Healthcare.

In February 2018, the Camillian Philanthropic and Health Development Office was inaugurated by the late Fr. Leo Pessini, MI, then Superior General, further strengthening the Camillians' commitment to healthcare and social outreach.

The Camillian Mission in Taiwan began on June 7, 1952 after the General Consulta approved its foundation. The Italian Camillians began their evangelization and pastoral care among the people (aborigines included) in the Luodong district, the area assigned by Msgr. Kuo, Archbishop of Taipei. Their missionary work extended to Pescadores Islands. Now a Delegation, it has three communities: Luodong, Taipei-Makung and Nan'ao.

In 2009, the pioneer Indonesian religious returned to Indonesia with Fr. Luigi Galvani, MI to establish the Foundation/Delegation of Indonesia, officially recognized in 2011 and attached to the Philippine Province.

On November 22, 2002, Most Rev. Kevin Manning, Bishop of Parramatta and then Camillian Provincial Superior Fr. Ivo Anselmi, MI (Far East Province) entered into an agreement wherein the Camillians take over the pastoral responsibility of Sacred Heart Parish in Westmead and hospital chaplaincy in Westmead Hospital and The Children's Hospital. The agreement took effect on January 1, 2003, the same date when Fr. Efen Balistoy, MI was appointed as the parish priest of Sacred Heart. At present there are now three houses that comprise the Australian Delegation: Wentworthville and Camperdown in New South Wales and Brisbane in Queensland.
